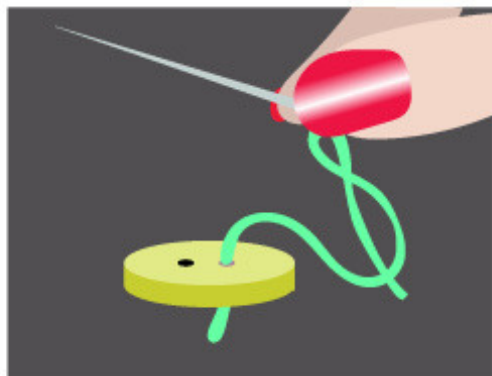
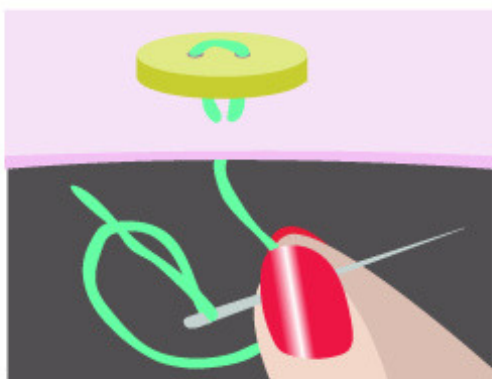


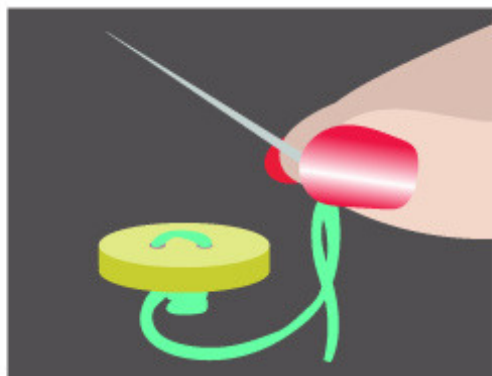
HOW TO SEW A TWO HOLE BUTTON



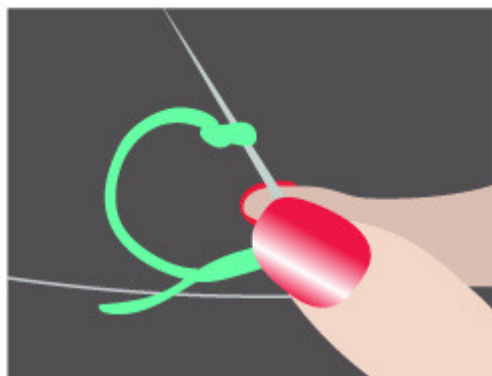
1. Thread your needle and knot the end. Push the threaded needle up through the back of one of the holes in your button. Pull until knot reaches the back of the fabric.



2. Push the needle through the second hole from the front of the button to the back. Pull excess thread through but don't tug too tight as you sew through the holes.



3. Push the threaded needle through the original hole from the back to the front, then push it through the other hole from the front to the back. Repeat this several times. Then make a thread shank to hold the button.



4. To finish: On the wrong side, push the needle and thread through the existing stitches to secure. Remove the needle and tie off the thread. Then cut off the excess.

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
